This annual program award community benefit grants and sponsorships to eligible organizations for events and projects that have a positive impact on health outcomes in each of the communities we serve.

To qualify for community benefit grants, an organization must be an IRS 501(c)(3) tax-exempt, non-profit and its program must address an identified health need within one of the following three funding priorities in the Community Health Needs Assessment. Currently, these areas of focus are:

- Substance use disorder

Chronic Disease Prevention

- Diabetes Management
- Obesity
- Cancer

Access to Care & Social Services

- Social Determinants of Health

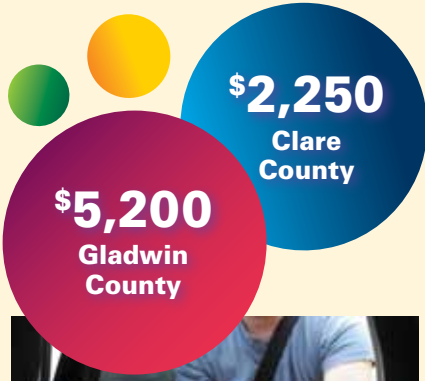

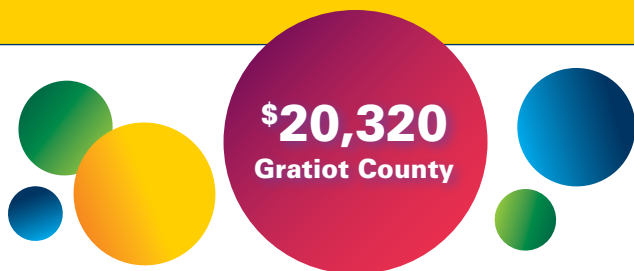

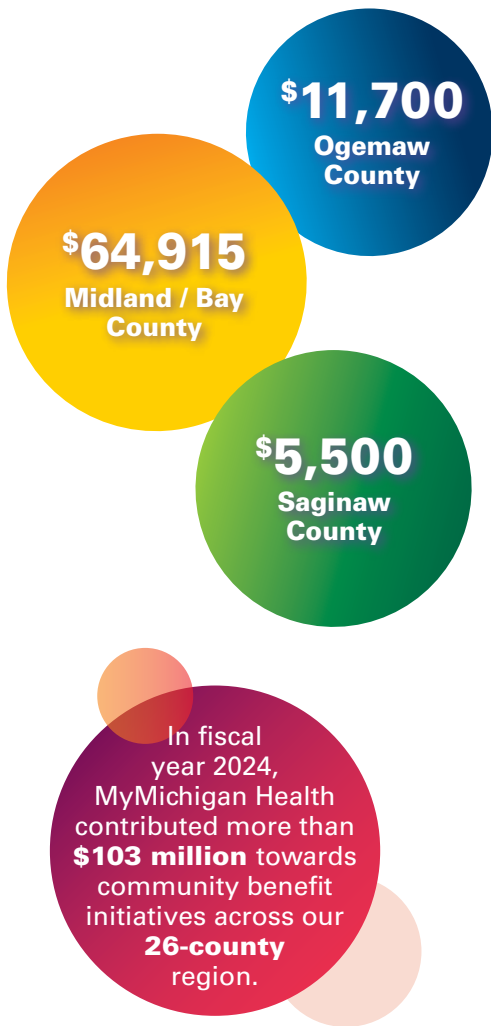

What Does it Mean to be Non-Profit

As a non-profit health-system, MyMichigan Health has the honor to invest back into the community by providing community benefits, which are programs and services designed to improve the community’s health, increase access to high quality care and reduce the burden of government or other community efforts. Our community benefit initiatives are based on the health priorities identified in the Community Health Needs Assessments conducted, every three years, for each of our communities. In fiscal year 2024, MyMichigan Health contributed more than \$103 million towards community benefit initiatives across our 26-county region.

MyMichigan Health’s financial contribution in fiscal year 2024 funded a broad spectrum of community benefits including:

- Charity care for uninsured and financially needy
- Unreimbursed cost for providing care for those insured through Medicare, Medicaid, and other government sponsored health insurance plans
- Medical research
- Educational opportunities for health professionals
- Community health education programs and support groups
- Financial donations to support

the health promotion efforts of non-profit organizations

- Community building activities that promote health and well-being of the community.

Improving the health in our communities is a responsibility we embrace, for without our communities MyMichigan Health would not exist. Community health improvement is a daunting challenge too large to belong to any single organization. Through our community benefit initiatives, we are partnering with other community organizations to live out our purpose in “Creating Healthy Communities – Together.”
